## ELECTION REPORT 2017 HAWAII FARMERS UINION UNITED CONVENTION KAHUMANA ORGANIC FARM, WAI'ANAE, OAHU, HAWAII October 7 & 8, 2017

The Hawaii Farmers Union United ("HFUU") held its annual 2017 Business Meeting and Convention on October 7 and 8, 2017 at Kahumanu Organic Farm, Wai'anae on Oahu Island, Hawai'i. Acting pursuant to appointment by the HFUU Board of Directors, I, Melissa Jenks-Olivit, served as the Chair of the Convention Nominations Committee together with members Eric Weinert, Jr. and Simon Russell. The Nominations Committee was responsible for the general oversight and conduct of the 2017 Convention Elections. This report documents the outcome those elections.

#### OCTOBER 7 BYLAWS AMENDMENT AND CHARTER APPROVAL

The Convention first convened pursuant to notice at about 2:30PM on October 7 to consider approval and adoption of the HFUU State Charter as previously approved by the National Farmers Union. A quorum was established in person and by Delegates attending the Convention.

By unanimous consent it was determined to add HFUU Resolution 04-2017 to the agenda, "AMENDING HFUU BYLAWS TO ADD DIRECTORS AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES" as follows:

[D]elete the number "(15)" in Section 5.1 B and amend Section 5.1 A of the HFUU Bylaws to increase the maximum number of HFUU Board Members from 15 to 19 and to permit the HFUU Board to add more members by a majority vote of the then sitting Directors as written below. <u>Underlining</u> indicates added language. Capitals in [BRACKETS] indicates deletions.

**5.1 Board of Directors and Officers, Numbers, Qualifications, and Meetings A. Number.** The HFUF Board of Directors ("Board") shall be composed of at least three (3) and up to [FIFTEEN (15)] <u>nineteen (19)</u>, at least one (1) Member from Chapters within each of the four counties, Hawai'i, Maui, Oahu, and Kauai, plus the President of Vice President and up to [NINE (9)] <u>thirteen (13)</u> additional Director positions from Chapters authorized at the island, county or other geographic locality at the discretion of the Board of Directors to achieve geographic representation, <u>provide necessary skills</u> or other <u>legitimate</u> purposes. The Board may expand the maximum number of allowed Board members by the affirmative vote of a majority of all of its then sitting Directors.

THE CONVENTION APPROVED THE BYLAW AMENDMENT BY UNANIMOUS CONSENT.

THE CONVENTION NEXT TOOK UP ADOPTION OF THE HAWAII FARMERS UNION NATIONAL FARMERS UNION ("NFU") CHARTER.

National Farmers Union, President, Roger Johnson, and Vice-President and Legal Counsel, David Velde, described the NFU Charter Process and the steps required to obtain the NFU Board's approval of Hawaii for Chartered status. It was then announced that NFU's Board of Directors determined that it is in the best interest of the organization to grant a charter to Hawaii. To do so, HFUU had to demonstrate significant membership growth, clear governance through a set of policies and procedures, and a pathway to financial stability and meaningful and transparency in recording of finances.

HFUU THEN CONVENED ITSELF AS A CHARTERING CONVENTION, AND ACTING BY UNANIMOUS CONSENT, THE CHARTERING CONVENTION VOTED TO ADOPT THE NFU CHARTER ESTABLISHING HAWAII AS A STATE DIVISION OF THE NATIONAL FARMERS UNION

#### OCTOBER 8, ELECTION OF VICE PRESIDENT

The Convention reconvened on October 8 to adopt policies and elect a Vice-President. Don Heacox (Kauai) and Kyle Studer (Ka'u) were nominated for the office of Vice-President to serve a term of two years. A quorum was present in person and by delegates. Without objection, the Convention waived voting by delegates. Those present in person who chose to vote then cast ballots for the office of HFUU Vice-President. Kyle Studer received 28 votes and Don Heacox 20. Kyle Studer was declared elected as HFUU Vice-President.

Also, you must notify the Department of Taxation in writing of all changes in your name or address, and of cancellation of your registration.

The exemption has been granted as of the effective date shown above. If your organization received certain types of income prior to this date, it may be subject to the general excise tax.

The exemption does not apply to any general excise tax (which includes the county surcharge) visibly passed on to the organization on any purchases made by the organization. Also, you must obtain a general excise license and pay the taxes owing from the conduct of any fundraising activities. For example, sales of sweet bread and chicken, and tickets for car washes and carnivals would be taxable.
